FUND MANAGER COMMENT

After two consecutive years of nearly double-digit returns and consistent outperformance of the benchmark, January was a flattish month for the fund. The benchmark index was on a similar trajectory and returned 0.3%.

News headlines were dominated by the newly inaugurated US president Donald Trump. These topics spanned from hotly debated tariffs to immigration. Despite this, government yields remained relatively stable during the month and FED held key rates unchanged as inflation seems to have picked back up in the past few months. In Europe, on the other hand, the Central Bank cut interest rates once again, as the Eurozone economy stagnated in 2024 Q4. Spreads of Emerging Markets relative to US treasuries reached multi-year lows despite the strong dollar and threat of tariffs. In Central Eastern Europe, S&P followed suit to Fitch and changed Romania's outlook to negative. However, a rating downgrade below investment grade is unlikely as the economy continues to expand and there is commitment to budget consolidation (2025 budget foresees 7% deficit; 8.6% in 2024).

As INVL Emerging Europe Bond Fund received large inflows at the end of the year, excess cash was invested in several top picks (Ulker, CEC Bank) and more liquid government names which were previously diluted. Moreover, we actively switched Banca Transilvania's 2028 issue to 2030 one, capturing a 50 bps yield pick-up. LHV Group's 2027 issue was the top contributor for the month, as the issue is illiquid and repriced sharply higher at the end of the month. Overall, the fund maintains lower interest rate sensitivity than the benchmark (3.5 and 4.4 duration respectively), while providing slightly higher yield to maturity.


